## Pedigreed Seed Crops in 2012

Although challenged with dry conditions in the Eastern part of Canada over the summer of 2012, inspected acreage across Canada appears to be up.

CSGA is still receiving soybean crop inspection reports, but early reports indicate inspected acreage at approximately 1.2 million acres (2011 inspected acreage was 1.1 million acres). The acreage increase appears to be a result of increased seed production of barley, soybeans and wheat.

## Are you Included in the Pedigreed Seed Locator Listings?

Paying up your CSGA account is important. Not only does it release your outstanding crop certificates but it also provides your farm with an added marketing boost. Only the fields that have been fully paid are displayed in provincial seed guides and in CSGA's national online Pedigreed Seed Locator at [www.seedlocator.net](http://www.seedlocator.net). If you want buyers of Certified seed to find you and your farm, it is in your best interest to double-check your CSGA account and tie up any loose ends.
